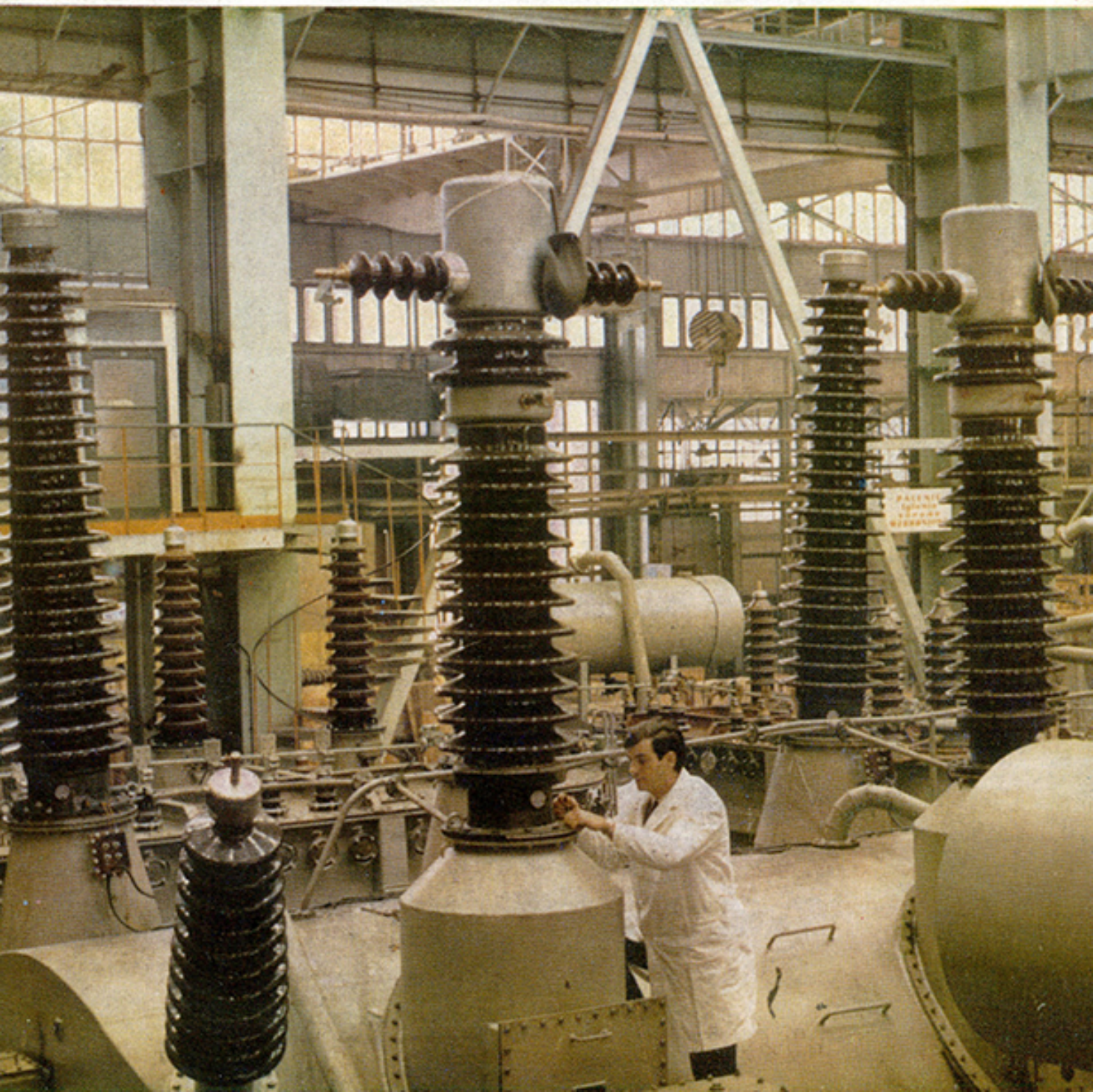

Medium-speed marine engines

The Polish shipbuilding industry occupies an important place in the world. The development of shipyards has been accompanied by the expansion of connected industries, including the industry of marine engines. The article on page 2 is a review of a group of medium-speed marine engines built on licences from FIAT, SULZER and SEMT-PIELSTICK by several Polish factories. The fact that the marine engines are produced on licences purchased from well-known companies guarantees supplies of tested engines and excellent after-sale service in all the major harbours of the world.

Technical services in foreign countries

Three articles (p.5,6,8) discuss the problem of services granted by POLSERVICE, Poland to foreign customers, comprising i.a.: the designing of a rolling mill for pipes, geodetical services, the elaboration of a masterplan of the sewage network in a big city. These examples bear evidence of the growing role of consulting in Poland's trade relations with foreign countries.

Equipment for the communal economy and environmental protection

Production of this equipment has been developing at a very dynamic pace in Poland in the current decade. Polish factories have been issuing new original constructions. The number of exported articles has increased. The article on page 11 presents a number of communal vehicles which were exhibited at the International Salon of Communal Equipment and Environmental Protection Equipment KOMEX 75 in Poznań.
