Cyclone furnace

High output at small dimensions, the possibility of using any type of fuel, a high degree of utilisation of the generated thermal energy are the main advantages of the universal industrial furnace of the 3rd generation in which the cyclone combustion area has been separated from spaces where the raw material is processed. During combustion (of coal, coal dust, industrial wastes) the furnace enables achievements of the planned process result (reduction, sublimation, evaporation, etc.). For details see p. 2.

Hay and straw harvesting and baling presses

The numerous advantages connected with the harvesting of straw and hay in the form of pressed bales have resulted in a development of the production of presses and auxiliary equipment for this technology of harvesting in Poland. The article on p. 8 discusses several such designs. Noteworthy are the machines for the harvesting of hay (and straw) in the form of large, rolled, cylindrical bales. In addition to a simple and highly reliable press (attached to a tractor), the Polish industry manufactures trucks for the transport of bales, bales carriers with pushing-off devices, bales loaders and tearers.

Food processing industry

This industry is represented in the present issue by two articles: A Protein Casing Factory (p. 21) and Consumption and Fodder Components from After-slaughter Bones (p. 18). The former presents the Polish production process of casings from a so-called collagen mass. The author points to the possibility of supplying complete factories. The latter article presents a line for the recovery of boiled meat, edible fat, concentrated brew and protein-phosphate meal. The line comprises 50 different pieces of equipment and is centrally controlled. There are possibilities of exporting also these lines.
